Make a chart and record weather information. Include the temperature, whether it is clear or cloudy, and whether it is calm or windy. Record the information each day for 7 days.	Create a watering can out of an empty milk jug. Have an adult help you rinse it out and poke holes in the cap. Fill it with tap water or collect rainwater using a funnel. Use your watering can to care for the plants outside.
