There will be books suitable for all ages. Infants and Preschool students are welcome to visit with their parents or carers.


There will be a wide range of books to buy.



An important person in a child's school life is the School Crossing Supervisor, who ensures they cross the road safely.

The role requires minimal hours out of your day and gives something worthwhile back to the community. The hours are usually 8:00am to 9:30am and/or 2:30pm to 4:00pm Monday to Friday during school terms. The base rate is \$20.39 - \$24.47 per hour.

All the qualifications you need are community spirit, good communication skills, an alert and professional attitude to work and a reliable personality.

The casual hours and school holidays would suit a parent or grandparent, a retiree or anyone wanting meaningful work - but not full time.

Training for your key responsibilities of directing traffic to stop at the designated crossing and giving clear instructions to infants and primary school students to cross the road safely, will be provided. You may be required to attend a health assessment. Appointment is subject to a Working with Children check clearance.
