# **Harmony Day**

Orange is the colour chosen to represent Harmony Week. Traditionally, orange signifies social communication and meaningful conversations. It also relates to the freedom of ideas and encouragement of mutual respect.

Last week at DWPS, we celebrated Harmony Week as a whole school. On Friday, students were able to come dressed in orange in support of our celebrations that occurred throughout the week. Across the grades, a variety of activities were offered for students to engage in. Some of those activities included;

Kindergarten: The students were able to draw themselves which shows how we are all different. We shared stories and books and had conversations with students around being kind and treating everyone with the same respect because we are all special and unique. We looked at the meaning of Harmony Day and made head bands that said 'Everyone Belongs'.

Stage 1: We have been celebrating our differences. The children have made paper cut outs—representing themselves and children of other cultures, all holding hands. They have drawn pictures of themselves and written words that describe themselves and what makes them—special and unique. Music from Indigenous artists was valued and appreciated, as well as —music from around the world.














# **The Midnight Gang Performance**






# **NATIONAL DAY OF ACTION against BULLYING and VIOLENCE**



# HEAD LICE ALERT

PLEASE CHECK YOUR CHILD'S HAIR TONIGHT!!

## TO CHECK

Check the scalp for insects or eggs.

Use a fine-tooth comb on wet hair then comb through the hair in sections looking for eggs or lice, repeat over a few days.

# TO TREAT

Wet the hair and scalp with conditioner or use chemical shampoo/ lotion (containing insecticide) - this will kill the lice and eggs. Using a fine metal comb, or special head lice comb you can get from a chemist, go through the hair in sections to comb the lice and eggs out.

Always re-treat 7-10 days after the first treatment, to kill any head lice that may have hatched from eggs that survived the first treatment.

## TIPS

- ✓ Check and treat the hair every night
  - ✓ Please tie up long hair for school
- If your child has head lice please check everyone in the family home
  - ✓ Do not share hairbrushes, towels, hats/ scarves etc.
