


Following this, we spent time in our classroom where we made '100 days smarter' crowns to wear all day. We joined back together as a whole year level to celebrate with cake.


Later in the day, Kindergarten completed other activities in their class based on '100'. It was a fun filled exciting day celebrating our learning. Bring on the next 100 days of learning.


