National Sorry Day and Reconciliation Week


Last Friday, 26th May was National Sorry Day and Reconciliation Week commenced on 27th and will conclude on 3rd June.

The theme for Reconciliation Week 9 2023 is '**be a voice for generations**'. It encourages all Australians to be a voice for reconciliation in tangible ways in everyday lives where we live, work and play.

National Sorry Day acknowledges the harm caused to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, particularly by policies which forcibly removed children from families and communities, known as the Stolen Generations.

National Reconciliation Week marks both the anniversary of the 1967 referendum and the Mabo decision and invites all Australians to continue the journey towards reconciliation.

Stage 3 did a beautiful collaborative art piece in recognition of National Sorry Day.



On Thursday, 1st June, students are asked to wear yellow clothes to school in recognition of the colour in the centre of the Aboriginal flag - the sun, the giver of energy and life. It is also the Children's Ground colour as it is fresh, energetic and hopeful. There is a gold coin donation for students to participate.




Tea Gardens has been a great experience for Stage 3 and we look forward to planning Canberra 2024.


