Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome to Week 6 and a big welcome to Autumn! Summer concluded with some very hot days and I am looking forward to some cooler weather.

It is great to see so many of our students wearing school uniform and school hats. Please remember, shirts, hats, drink bottles and lunch boxes are available to purchase from the Front office.

Attendance

Regular attendance at school is very important and supports students to continue to reach their academic goals. It is monitored by classroom teachers, me, and the Attendance Team. Students are expected to be at school everyday unless they are unwell, or a circumstance has arisen that prevents them from being in attendance. All absences **MUST** be explained to the school. This can be via written note, phone call or message through Parent Portal.

Classroom teachers have their own classroom rewards in place and I have an award each week for the class with the highest attendance percentage.

Last week – the winner is Giinmas with a **fabulous 100%.** This was closely followed by 1/2C with 96% and Miss Gibson's class have has the highest increase in overall attendance by 15%.

Our school attendance is currently 80% - this needs to be much higher. I hope to share a larger attendance percentage in next week's newsletter.

BUDYABUDYAS CLASSROOM NEWS




This year we have continued to learn new skills in Circus and positive sportsmanship at Moriarty.
