Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome to Week 7 at our beautiful school. There a couple of additional items attached the newsletter this week. I am writing this Newsletter whilst overlooking gorgeous Mount Panorama at Bathurst. Mrs Read and I are engaging in professional learning focussed on **Clarity – What Matters Most in Learning, Teaching and Leading** based on the work of Canadian educator, Lyn Sharratt. We visited Wallerawang PS yesterday and had the opportunity to watch Sharratt's theories put into practice. It was very insightful and we are very excited to begin the journey with our staff and students at Dubbo West.

Attendance

Congratulations to 1/2A for having the highest attendance in Week 6. Ms Harris will deliver ice blocks to your classroom – keep an eye out for her. Overall whole school attendance has increased to 83 %!

Attendance is a focus across all schools and as a result, it has been identified as an area for improvement in our School Improvement Plan (SIP). There will be continued support from school to families to ensure our students are at school more than 90% of the school year.

Stewart House

Stewart House is an amazing resource for students across NSW and one that I, alongside many of 3/4N my teacher colleagues, make a small donation to each fortnight. Over the years we have had 5/6D many students from Dubbo West participate in the program. Each year 1,600 public school 5/6H children in need come to Stewart House from many parts of NSW and the ACT. During their stay, children are provided with optometric, dental and medical treatment as well as emotional support

This is balanced with health and educational programs and out of school activities to boost their self-esteem and promote a healthier lifestyle. Children in the care of Stewart House attend a specific purpose school onsite for up to 10 days of their 12-day stay. The NSW Department of Education provides infrastructure and staffing support for this school. All other costs associated with the children's stay are met from charitable donations. Children between school years 2 and 8 are invited to attend the program.

Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been great to have our students back in classrooms and settling into the school year. I know all our teachers are looking forward to a successful 2024 and are excited to work with you to make this a memorable year for your child.

The evidence is clear that consistent attendance is the essential first step for your child to have a positive experience at school.

Every day matters for your child's learning. In recent years we've seen too many students miss a day of school here and there. Missing school for students means missing assignments, time with friends, an important maths lesson or getting picked for a sports team. With days missed, years are lost.

Students are required to attend school every day, whether it's the first or last day of the term, Mondays, Fridays or days dedicated to sports carnivals, school excursions and incursions.

Help us make sure your child is achieving their best and stays ahead in their learning with regular school attendance. The more time your child attends school, the greater their opportunity to learn, make new friends and improve their wellbeing. Together, let's build positive attendance habits for a lifetime.

If your child is absent from school, please let us know why as soon as possible, even if it's just a few minutes at the start or end of the school day. Of course, there will be times when your child is unable to be at school (like when they are unwell). Medical appointments should take place outside school hours where possible and family holidays should be taken in term breaks.

If your child is feeling anxious about coming to school and you need support, please reach out to your child's teacher or me directly.
