

Have a family member make an obstacle course inside or outside of your home. How fast can you get through the course? Try it again and see if you can beat your time!	Head outside and lie down in the grass. Look at the clouds in the sky. What do you see? Do you see a cloud that looks like a heart? How about a face? Spend at least 5 minutes finding 'objects' in the sky.	Draw a picture of something that has happened in the past, something that is currently happening, and something you predict will happen in the future.

Craft Instructions

Following in My Daddy's Shoes Father's Day Card

Supplies

- Childs foot, shoe or wellie
- Adult shoe or wellie
- Two different coloured washable paints in large
- Sponges
- A3 white or pale coloured card x 2





1 Take the A3 card and fold it in half. Then place it ready to be printed on; it needs to be portrait and so that it opens from right to left. The large shoe will be printed first, followed by the smaller shoe.



2 Dip some sponge into the paint, then use this to dap the paint onto the sole of the shoe. Then place the shoe carefully onto the card, heel first, then rolling it down to the toe end. Do this at an angle, corner to corner, leave to dry.



Repeat step 2 with the smaller shoe, wellie or foot. This time print inside the larger print, again heel first then rolling down to the toe.



You may also like to write the message 'Following in my daddy's shoes' on the card.



Craft Instructions

'I Love You to the Moon' Father's Day Card

Supplies

- Blue or black card
- Coloured paper
- Star stickers
- Felt pens
- Scissors
- Stiff card
- Pencil



- Glue stick
- Small photograph
- Speech bubble cut out



1 Fold the blue or black card in half to form a card template.



5 Cut the photograph into a circle shape, then glue in to place.



Now make a slit in the card for the rocket to slide through. To do this, use a pencil and ruler to draw a faint line going from the top to the bottom of the card, about 2cm in from the fold. Then cut along this line, leaving around 2cm at the top and the bottom.



6 Cut out the phrase I love you to the moon and back' and stick it onto the card. Remember to leave space for the rocket.



Now make a rocket using the different coloured paper. To do this, we drew around a rectangle for the main rocket, a triangle for the top, some circles for the window and then cut them out.



Now decorate the main part of the card to create a background for the rocket. We have used a crescent shaped moon and some



Position the different shapes to make the rocket, then stick them down using glue.



8 Finally cut a strip of stiff card and glue on to the back of the rocket. Then thread the strip through the slit in the card. You now have a moving rocket on the card!



Father's Day Trophy

Supplies

- 2 Paper cups
- Masking tape
- Double Sided Sticky Tape
- Coloured card
- Gold paint
- Scissors
- Foam shapes



- Glitter
- Glue
- Handle Templates





 Using masking tape, join both paper cups bottom to bottom.



3 Paint the cups and D shapes in gold paint, then leave to dry.



2 Draw and cut out two 'D' shapes from the card to form the handles for the trophy.



4 Using double sided sticky tape, attach the handles to either side of the cup.




5 Decorate the trophy as desired. You may want to use cut outs from the card and foam.

Father's Day Bacon and Corn Fritters

Ingredients

- 1 cup of self-raising flour
- 1 cup whole milk
- 2 eggs
- 2 cups corn kernels
- 1 cup of mozzarella cheese
- 2 bacon rashers
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- Salt and pepper

A selection of sauces

Equipment

Wooden spoon

Large mixing bowl

Frying pan

Tongs

Paper towel

Plate

Tablespoon

Spatula

Method

- Using a wooden spoon and a large mixing bowl, stir together the flour, milk, eggs, corn and cheese.
- Place the bacon rashers into a frying pan on medium heat with some of the olive oil.
- Cook the bacon for 5-8 minutes. Use tongs to turn the bacon over.
- Take the bacon out of the frying pan and place onto a plate with some paper towels.
- 5. Pour some more olive oil into the pan.
- Drop one heaped tablespoon of the fritter batter into the pan. Use the tablespoon to flatten the mixture.
- Cook the fritter for two minutes so that it's golden brown on one side.
- Use a spatula to flip the fritter over and cook for another 1-2 minutes.
- Remove the fritter from the pan when both sides are nicely golden and drain onto some paper towels.
- Continue steps 6-10 until all the fritter batter has been cooked.
- 11. Serve with the bacon and a selection of sauces.



Father's Day Big Breakfast Recipe

Ingredients

- 2 sausages
- 2 rashers of bacon
- 1 tomato
- 6 mushrooms
- 1 small tin of baked beans
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup of milk
- 2 slices of wholegrain bread

Butter

Salt and pepper

Olive oil spray

A selection of sauces

Equipment

Microwave

Cling wrap

Medium frying pan

Chopping board

Knife





Method

- Use the chopping board and knife to cut the tomato in half and slice up the mushrooms.
- Spray the frying pan with some olive oil spray and place on the stove.
- Place the sausages, mushrooms and tomatoes in the pan.
- When the sausages are almost cooked, add in the bacon.
- When the ingredients have finished cooking, turn off the heat and use the tongs to place everything onto a serving plate. Keep the serving plate in a warm place.
- Crack the eggs into a bowl with the milk and salt and pepper.
- 7. Whisk the ingredients until they are well combined.
- Place the egg mixture into the frying pan and put it on the stove on a low heat.
- Use the spatula to gently lift the eggs from the pan as they cook so that they become scrambled.
- 10. Use the spatula to put the eggs onto the serving plate.
- 11. Place the two slices of bread into the toaster.
- Place the baked beans into a bowl, cover with cling wrap and place in the microwave for one minute.
- Once the bread has been toasted, place this onto the serving plate with the sausages, mushrooms tomato and eggs.
- 14. Butter the toast using the knife and serve with sauces.





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
