Included in the packs are reference sheets to the NSW foundation style font letters and numbers. This can be helpful when supporting your childs writing. Flash cards of the letter sounds we have learnt and continue to practise have also been included. We suggest practising these sounds daily as repetition is key for mastery of the skill.

Our school website includes a tab for learning at home. There are links to further educational and some fun activities to complete if you choose.

Frances and Mark were given a bag of lollies. They shared them out <u>evenly</u> and had one left over. How many lollies could there have been in the bag? How many different answers can you find?

Time

Get an adult to draw a big circle on a piece of paper. Investigate a clock in your house or online.

Draw the numbers in the circle. Use a straw, pencil or anything you can find and make the hour and minute hand. Play 'what's the time Mr Wolf with time to the hour e.g. I O'clock, then make this time on your clock.

Write numbers to 30

Focus on correct number formation.

Extension: If you can, write numbers up to 100 on a piece of paper. Make sure you also focus on correct number formation.

Count collections

Walk around your house and collect some objects. For example, blocks, toys, coloured pencils, books, socks or shoes.

Make two groups and count how many are in each group. Which one has the most?

Investigation

I have a row of 10 connector cubes/blocks. It gets broken into two pieces. How many cubes/blocks are on each side? Can you think of more than one answer for the question? (friends of 10)

Shape Hunt

Go on a 2D object hunt around your home! Find an item that is a circle, a triangle, a square, and a rectangle. Draw and label each one in your journal.

Extension Counting

Counting patterns. Write your numbers on a piece of paper using different counting patterns. For example: 5's (5,10,15,20 etc) and 10's (10, 20, 30....) up to 100.

Counting

How high can you count? Get an adult to listen to you count. Record how high you can count and try again tomorrow.

Repeat counting backwards, start a 10, if successful, count back form 20, 30 or 40 etc.

Before and After

Choose five random numbers between 1-30. Then find the numbers before and after. Record answers on a piece of paper.

Extension. Choose five random numbers between 50–100 and do the same thing. (before and after).
